Dear Friends,

Let me start this letter by telling you how grateful I am for your continued and generous support of International Christian Enterprise and its ministry. Despite the fact that we are a small, volunteer-based organization, the impact that we are making on the lives of Romanians cannot be overstated. Your prayers and gifts, through God’s grace, have enabled us to assist the Christian Church in Romania in developing and encouraging Christian leadership, starting new churches, and reaching out to those in desperate need of hope.

2009 was a milestone year for ICE. During the year both ICE and our partners at the Elpis Foundation in Dej, Romania celebrated our Tenth Anniversaries. Six members of ICE’s Board of Directors, along with some family members, traveled to Dej to share in the October 17th celebration honoring Elpis’ tenth year in service. It was a blessing to hear testimony of the impact that we have had, through our support of Elpis, in the lives of so many. This was the first trip to Romania for some of the Board members and it was particularly beneficial to the ministry as each had an opportunity to hear the testimonies and witness the work firsthand. I hope to be able to share their experiences in future ministry updates.

If last year was a year to remember all that God has done through this ministry, 2010 promises to be a year of change. You may have already noticed that this letter is not coming from Ken Shultz, but from his son Perry. I am sure you are also aware that Dad has had to reduce the frequency and duration of his trips to Romania over the past couple of years in order to care for Mom, as she deals with the effects of Parkinson’s Disease. After much prayer and consideration, he determined he could no longer be as involved in the ministry of ICE as he had previously. So, at his request, the Board of Directors has replaced him as President of ICE and is working to transfer the operational responsibilities of the organization to other Board members.

So, what will be changing? Hopefully, not much. Over the past ten years ICE has developed a strong trust and ministry relationship with Vasile Pop, Founder and President of the Elpis Foundation, as well as Elpis’ Director of Missions, Calin Morar. We were blessed to meet extensively with these men in January and are very pleased with the strategy that they are developing for their ministry. For ICE, perhaps the greatest change will be an increased emphasis and visibility for our supporters regarding the role that the Elpis Foundation plays in our ministry and directly identifying these workers as the faces of ICE’s ministry in Romania. We anticipate less travel from the United States to Romania, and possibly more from Romania to the U.S., so that we can involve more of ICE’s leadership in strategy discussions. We also hope to make our Romanian friends more accessible for meeting with you, your churches, and your friends to discuss the ministry in which we are engaged.

Perhaps another change will be an increasing involvement by other Board members. As a direct result of Board members’ experiences in October, we are already planning two different ministry opportunities for 2010. Board member Charles Lavine is planning a pastoral training seminar for this fall. And, members of my family and those of Board Vice-President Peter Escue are planning a trip to Dobrogea, Romania targeting the Romanian Turks – identified as one of the unreached people groups in Romania.

So, what won’t be changing? We don’t intend to change our commitment to helping the Christians in Romania develop effective, committed leadership and to assisting them in spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We also won’t be changing our desire to keep you involved in the ministry and to share in what God is doing through



your prayers, volunteer efforts, and financial support. Finally, we remain committed to serving God in whatever capacity He ordains and to be good stewards of the resources He has provided for this ministry.

So, work is continuing. While I write this, we have volunteers in the Carolinas preparing to load another shipping container of much needed mattresses, furniture and clothing. We are in the planning stages of the trips for this summer and fall, and we continue to provide support for the daily operations of Elpis.


As you pray for our ministry, I would ask you to pray for the following things in particular:

- The ICE Board of Directors as we work out the next steps in this transition and become more actively involved in the day-to-day operations. Particularly pray that we will be listening attentively to God's direction for this ministry.
- The workers in Romania, that they will have a clear vision for what God wants them to achieve for His purposes and that they will be encouraged to continue in this often difficult work.
- Thank God for those that have become interested in this ministry through meetings with ICE Board Members, Vasile Pop and Calin Morar over the past few weeks.
- For safe travels as Vasile Pop and Calin & Dora Morar return to Romania from their visit here.
- And pray for Ken and Doris Shultz as they adjust to the many changes in their lives and deal this health issues.
